BRIERCREST CHRISTIAN ACADEMY:

New name, same mission

High school education in Caronport has a new name for the same mission. After operating for 72 years under the name Caronport High School, the school will officially change its name to Briercrest Christian Academy this July.

For Vice Principal Derek Zacharias, the new name will better reflect the school's mission and relationship to Briercrest. "It allows people to know that we are a part of the three-school system and that we all have the same fundamental basis from which we provide a

high level of education," said Zacharias.

Briercrest Christian Academy will continue to pursue the original vision set forth in 1946 for Caronport High School. In a statement, the school affirmed: "Our prayer is that we would be positioned to help a higher quantity of students achieve their academic, athletic, and artistic dreams while unapologetically pushing them to walk with Jesus, understand their call, and make significant impact for the Kingdom of God."

NEW PARTNERSHIP WITH BIOLA UNIVERSITY

Provides exclusive pathway to Master of Arts TESOL

Briercrest has partnered with California's Biola University to allow students to complete both their BA and MA TESOL degrees in just five years. The 4 + 1 program combines Briercrest's four-year BA with a one-year accelerated MA from Biola to be taken at any point after graduation.

David Catterick, Briercrest TESOL program leader, is excited about the partnership's ministry focus. "That's the heart of our program; that's the heart of their program. In effect, by giving them students, we're giving Biola opportunities to further train our students and then propel them into ministry around the world."

With this new pathway, two ministry-minded schools unite to provide students with the skills they need to serve abroad. The compatibility between both degree programs also proves something that Briercrest students have always known: Briercrest TESOL promises comprehensive, high-level academics—and delivers on these promises.

UPDATES

We currently have several projects underway and the support of our alumni, corporate friends, and family members is greatly appreciated. Here are a few examples of what we are working on:

GYMNASIUM PROJECT | Our summer work crew has given the gym a facelift. The project included building new interior walls, adding insulation for warmth, and brightening up the space with a fresh coat of paint.

NEW HEATING UNITS | Our overhead heating units are starting to age and need to be replaced. Our priority this year is to install units at the front of the Hildebrand/Edwards Chapel and in the eastern wing of BCA.

NEW SIDEWALKS | Several sidewalks on campus are being replaced for health and safety reasons, including the sidewalk from Whittaker dorm to the gym and the sidewalk outside of BCA.

FOOTBALL CLUBHOUSE | We are adding finishing touches to the high school football program clubhouse as funding allows.

NEW LIGHTS FOR THE ARENA | By investing in LED lights, we can improve the lighting in the Barkman Arena and save on our energy bills. We expect that the energy savings will pay for the lights in less than two years.

NEW FLOORING FOR THE HIGH SCHOOL | The project includes new laminate flooring, carpeting in the entryways, and new paint throughout the upper and lower hallways for a cleaner facility.

REPURPOSED CHAIRS | We are purchasing 220 new chairs for the Edwards Chapel and repurposing the existing chairs to replace the old ones in the Isabel Whittaker dorm, which are from the early 70s.
