

BRIERCREST SEMINARY


Accessible and relevant education for the Church

SEMINARY LIFE: We continue to be thankful to God for his blessing and providential care in these challenging days. Our overall course registrations continue to be trending upward and we are seeing evidence of strength and vitality even during the recent disruption.

The global pandemic did interrupt some of our initial plans, including our faculty searches in New Testament, Leadership and Management, and Marriage and Family Therapy, plans for celebrating graduation in April, as well our accreditation self-study for the Association of Theological Schools. We were able to make an abrupt adjustment in a manner of days to offer our courses on an online platform and both professors and students were able to pivot admirably. We have been able to secure sufficient faculty for the short term and we are proceeding with great enthusiasm into this next school year.

New opportunities for students continue to develop as transfer agreements with Prairie College and Horizon College and Seminary have been added to our current partnerships with Renovaré Canada, Arrow Leadership, and the Coalition for Youth Ministry Excellence. Increased concentrations in our MDiv program have added further flexibility for students seeking specific training in key ministry specializations.

CENTRE FOR LEADERSHIP STUDIES: The Centre continues to offer seven graduate level certification and develop wider educational offerings to support those who are looking for just-in-time personal and professional development. Tristan Norton has been hired as Director of the Centre and is spearheading a number of these newer initiatives. The addition of the Teaching Studio in the past year has been providential as it has served the needs of the institution well in these days of online course design. The Centre will continue to broaden the impact of what the Seminary has to offer to those we serve.

Staff and students presented wartime letters, songs, and poems in honour of those who paid the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom, and though free of charge, a large offering in support of our department was gratefully received from a very appreciative audience.

A BRIERCREST CHRISTMAS: Our 2019 production, A Father's Love, presented an original story of a young man's faith and sacrifice that poignantly invited our 3,000 guests to respond to God's love for themselves. Complete with carols, a nativity, and period costumes, this beloved annual event continues to draw audiences from all over the province.

FACULTY RECITAL FOR FOOD BANK: Our newest tradition is our annual faculty recital at St. Aidan Anglican Church in support of the Moose Jaw & District Food Bank. No less than two large bins of non-perishable foodstuffs have been collected each year from community members who come to hear our music faculty perform.

CONSERVATORY OF PERFORMING ARTS: Now going into its third year, the Briercrest Conservatory of Performing Arts recently expanded its reach into Moose Jaw and Assiniboia, offering private lessons and group classes to even more young musicians and performers. Our strings ensemble was approved for an operations grant from the Saskatchewan Orchestral Association and continues to attract young violinists looking to improve their skills.

KEEPING THE FAITH CAMPAIGN UPDATE

We are so thankful for God's faithfulness. He continues to use Briercrest to help young adults Keep the Faith. We are so humbled and blessed by this privilege to provide an education that disciples young people and gives them the things they need to mature in their faith as they enter adulthood.

Since we launched our *Keeping the Faith* campaign in the Fall of 2019, God has continued bringing faithful partners like to you support His mission here at Briercrest. We are so thankful for you!

It is our desire and prayer to make Christian education more affordable so that we can disciple more young adults and help them solidify their faith with daily discipleship, daily chapel, and godly instruction and mentorship in the classroom. And so, after prayerful consideration, we set a goal to raise \$8.9 million dollars in two years for the Briercrest Education Fund.







FINANCIAL UPDATE
